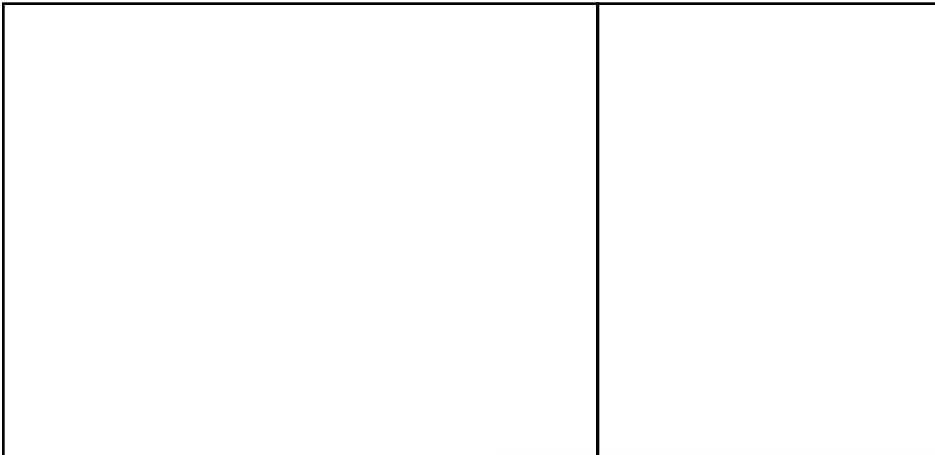

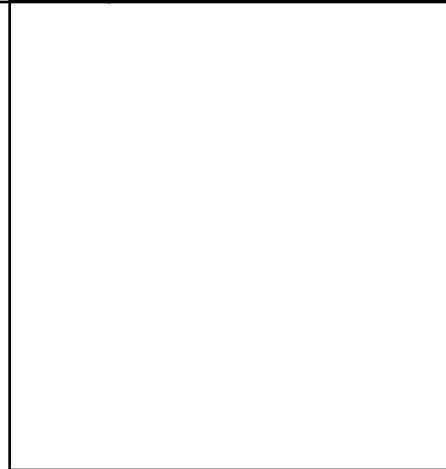

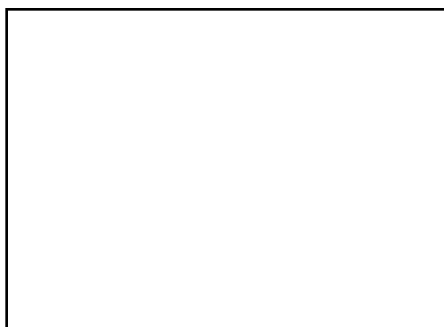
Pancakes turn big profits for South

Hartnett '96 appears in "Pearl Harbor"

Josh Hartnett '96 starred as a fighter pilot in this summer's big movie, "Pearl Harbor". He was featured in the *Star Tribune's* May 25, 2001 issue of Free Time. Writer Jeff Strickler discusses the young actor and his new stardom status. "Pearl Harbor" is Hartnett's seventh movie and has propelled his name to the top. As "Pearl Harbor" flew into theaters, Hartnett was off to Africa working on yet another movie, "Black Hawk Down".

Hartnett was born in San Francisco and grew up in the Twin Cities. After graduating from South High School, he attended acting school in New York City and then moved to Los Angeles. In just

two weeks, he had his first acting job, a role in the 1997 crime drama "Cracker", which led to movie offers. He can also be seen in "Halloween H20", "The Faculty" and a Minnesota-made movie, "Here On Earth".

In Strickler's article, producer Jerry Bruckheimer states, "We believe him when he says his lines. He's a cross between Gary Cooper and Montgomery Clift. I don't know if it's because he's from Minnesota and the heartland, but he possesses the ability to make you feel like everything's going to be all right."

Hartnett was also featured in the national publication, Vanity Fair.

Neva Walker '90 in the House

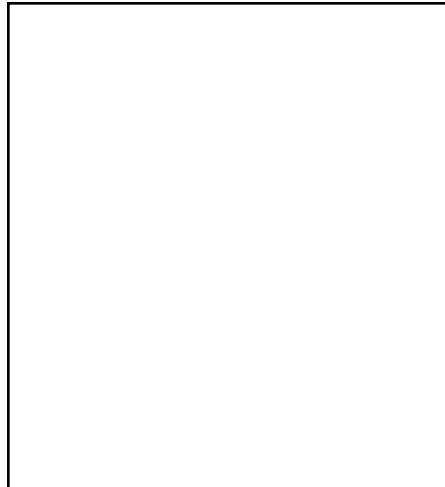

On November 7, 2000, South High School class of 1990 graduate and DFL-endorsed Neva Walker was elected State Representative for South Minneapolis-61B. In this role, Neva is the first African-American woman to serve in the Minnesota State Legislature.

Upon graduating from SHS, Neva went on to study sociology and child psychology at University of Minnesota-Twin Cities campus. She is also the proud mother of her 13-year-old son, Shae, who is more than six feet tall and wears a size sixteen shoe!

Neva has spent her life giving back to the community. She chose to continue this in her career as an organizer, volunteer and counselor. In these roles, Neva worked with people to identify their shared issues and concerns regarding such social and economic justice issues as affordable housing, education, developmental disabilities, and youth programs.

In Neva's search for possible solutions to her neighbors prevalent needs, she determined that State Representative status would give her the most power to



advocate for the residents of District 61B, and help to improve their lives.

"Our diverse community has rich potential, but there are many acute problems we must address before this potential can be realized. As Minnesota State Representative for South Minneapolis-61B, I am positioned well to ensure my neighbors' voices are heard, and to empower them to exercise the privileges, rights and responsibilities that come with American citizenship," Neva says.

Joyce Fox, a retired Title I paraprofessional for the Richfield Schools, began a new career tutoring as a volunteer at Opportunity Workshop Inc. in 1986. Now known as Opportunity Partners, it is a nonprofit organization that provides training and services for adults with developmental disabilities or traumatic brain injuries.

While raising their own son, Joyce and her husband Charlie found Opportunity Workshop—a great source of support in dealing with his brain injury. Recognizing the need for support resources, Joyce served on the board of directors and contributed many hours of her time during the early years. She continues to serve as a valuable asset at Opportunity Partners today.

Fox helps individuals with language and recreational skills, using games and conversation. She works one-on-one and encourages them to succeed using their own unique abilities. She is inspired by the courage of the people she works with, and finds ways to improve their lives. The staff considers her to be a wonderful tutor and the people she works with love her. Joyce has made a big difference for a great number of people.

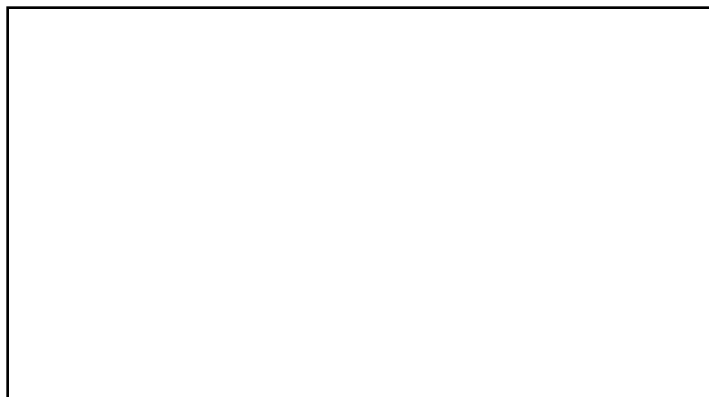
South wins one for the city

Minneapolis South became the first city public school team since 1958 to win a boys' team tennis championship with a 6-1 victory over Mahtomedi in the Class AA final June 6, 2001.

The Tigers have relished their image as tennis outsiders—city kids excelling at a country-club sport—and wear team T-shirts reading "South: Ghetto Tennis". It's a moniker the entire team rallies around.

"It says a lot about us," said South captain and No. 2 singles player Tim Klein. "We play our home matches at Powderhorn Park and that scares some teams. A lot of us—me and Mikey Kantar and Andy Born and Allen Gleckner—grew up in the Urban Tennis program and we used to talk about winning the state tournament. I think it's wonderful that a city team does this."
